EVERI is an umbrella organization of national and European associations of veterinarians employed in the sectors of education, research and/or industry, founded in 2005.

Veterinarians employed in research at universities, colleges, governmental agencies, or in industry are dedicated to finding new ways to prevent and treat animal and human health disorders. Veterinarians are also employed in management, technical sales and services, and other positions in agribusinesses, pet food companies, and pharmaceutical companies.

#### Objectives

The objectives of EVERI are to provide members with up-to-date information on Counsel of Europe and EU policies and legislation related to education, professional qualifications, medicines and welfare of laboratory animals, to provide a platform for veterinarians working in those fields, to promote professional representation at the level of European decision making bodies, and to be a coordinator between the different members and FVE.

EVERI is a section of the Federation of Veterinarians of Europe (FVE). FVE aims to unite the European veterinary profession for the benefit of animal health, animal welfare and public health.

FVE strives to maintain a structure to assemble opinions from all members of the European veterinary body and to formulate these opinions into one corporate voice.

#### **Extra Mural Studies**

All veterinary students need to spend some time gaining work experience in the various fields of the veterinary profession. Veterinary faculties help in offering suitable places. And generally areas such as farm animal and companion animal practice are covered well. Less common areas do not immediately attract young graduates and are harder to find, while being not less interesting.

EVERI is setting up an information hub to facilitate contact between students, the various colleges of specialization and private enterprises on a European and international level. EVERI is also aiming to establish extramural study opportunities which fulfill certain conditions demonstrating content, ambition and contribution of the studies to the curriculum to be eligible for credits.

In the first instance the project focuses on addressing the position of Laboratory Animal medicine through its contacts with ESLAV (European Society for Laboratory Animal Veterinarians). However, beyond that other opportunities will be established.
